## **REMINDER: 'Flu Vaccinations**

All children from Reception to Year 6 from September 2020 are eligible for a Free Nasal Childhood 'Flu Vaccination.

The VirginCare team will be administering the vaccinations at Langley Fitzurse on **Friday 13 November**, and will adhere to all up to date Infection Control, PPE and social distancing guidance at the time.

'Flu vaccination is one of the most effective interventions we have to reduce pressure on the health and social care system which is going to be more important than ever this year. For this reason, it is essential we deliver the vaccine to as many children as possible to prevent the spread of infection to those most at risk in society.

In light of the above we are expecting demand to be high and therefore we urge you to follow the below link to consent to your child's vaccination now. Even if you do not want your child to receive this vaccination, please complete the consent form stating "no" consent. You will also find answers to your FAQ's on this link.

## A QUICK Reference guide for COVID Absence

This information has come via a local school and gives a clear guide for parents should children show signs and symptoms of COVID. Should guidance change regarding self isolation we will en-

What to do if.....	Action Needed	Return to School when....
<b>My Child has covid-19 symptoms:</b> <b>High Temperature</b> – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back; <b>A new continuous cough</b> – this means coughing for longer than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24hrs; <b>A Loss or change to your sense of smell or taste:</b> this means that you have noticed that you cannot smell or taste anything.	<b>DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL</b> Contact the school to inform us Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days; Get a test <b>INFORM THE SCHOOL IMMEDIATELY OF THE TEST RESULT</b>	...the test comes back negative
<b>My Child tests positive for Covid-19....</b>	<b>DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL</b> Contact school to inform us Agree and earliest date for possible return <b>Minimum of 10 days</b> Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days; Bubble/isolates/remote learning	...they feel better. <b>They can return after minimum 10 days</b> , even if they have a cough, or loss of taste/smell – these symptoms can last for several weeks.
<b>My Child tests negative</b>	<b>CONTACT THE SCHOOL</b> Discuss when your child can come back to school (same day/next day)	...the test comes back negative
<b>My child is ill with symptoms not linked to Covid-19</b>	<b>FOLLOW USUAL SCHOOL ABSENCE PROCEDURE – PLEASE CALL 01249 750295</b>	As soon as recovered, or, in the case of Sickness, <b>48hrs after the last bout of sickness/diarrhoea</b>
<b>Someone in my household has covid-19 symptoms</b>	<b>DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL</b> Contact the school to inform us Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days; Household members to get tested <b>INFORM THE SCHOOL IMMEDIATELY OF THE TEST RESULT</b>	...the test comes back negative
<b>Someone in my household tests positive for covid-19 symptoms</b>	<b>DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL</b> Contact the school to inform us Agree and earlier date for possible return – <b>Minimum of 14 days</b>	...the child has completed <b>14 days of isolation</b>
<b>NHS Test and Trace has identified that my child has been in close contact with someone with symptoms of confirmed Covid-19</b>	<b>DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL</b> Contact the school to inform us Agree and earlier date for possible return – <b>Minimum of 14 days</b>	...the child has completed <b>14 days of isolation</b>
<b>We/my child has travelled and has to isolate in a period of quarantine</b>	<b>Do not take unauthorised leave in term time</b> Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel Agree and earlier date for possible return – <b>Minimum of 14 days</b>	...the quarantine period of <b>14 days has been completed</b>
<b>We have received medical advice that my child must continue to shield</b>	<b>DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL</b> <b>CONTACT THE SCHOOL</b> Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again	...You are informed that shielding requirement is lifted
<b>My child's bubble is closed due to a covid-19 outbreak in school</b>	<b>DO NOT COME INTO SCHOOL</b> At home support your child with remote education provided by the school Your child will need to <b>isolate for 14 days</b>	...School will inform you when the bubble will be reopened
