Parents' Evenings

This term we have all been busy settling ourselves back into school and this new way of working.

During this term, your child's class teachers have been completing baseline assessments. These have been informal day-to day assessments, the kinds of things that teachers do day in day out as part of their normal practice; but they will also be undertaking more formal assessments towards the end of this term.

We would like to share this information with you during Parent Teacher Meetings after half term.

This year they will look a little different. Teachers will be holding 10 minute telephone meetings rather than the usual face to face we have had in the past.

Hercules and Pegasus appointments will be arranged w/c 9th November and Phoenix and Chameleon w/c 16th November.

We will open online bookings shortly.

Individual School Photographs

The School photographer will be talking individual photographs on **Monday 19th October.**

We are able to offer sibling photographs this year, this includes children younger than school age.

In order to be COVID safe and mitigate the spread of germs, the following protocols will be put in place:

- Photographs for siblings will take place before the school day at 8.30am
- Parent should enter the school grounds and make their way into the playground by the 'kitchen/playground' gate. A member of staff will be on duty to support with this.
- Families should wait outside in the playground until the photographer is ready for them.
 Hopefully the weather will be kind!
- Only one family will be allowed in the hall at one time. Children and adults should anti-bac hands and adults should wear masks.
- Seating will be wiped down in between sibling photographs.
- All families should socially distance whilst waiting.

For the rest of the school:

- Children will be taken to Cherry Hall in class bubbles.
- Seating will be wiped down in between class bubbles.
- Normal hand hygiene will operate on leaving and re-entering the classrooms.
- On this day, all children should come to school in their normal school uniform, regardless of whether their class has PE timetabled. Class teachers will plan appropriate PE activities to accommodate school uniform on this day.

What does Christian Distinctiveness mean at Langley Fitzurse School?

As a Church of England School, in addition to Ofsted inspections, church schools also receive a denominational inspection - the Church of England's Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS), which assesses the effectiveness of Church of England schools as Church schools. This meets the requirements of section 48 of the Education Act 2005 and aims to make a significant contribution to the improvement of church schools.

Our SIAMS inspection is due sometime during this academic year, subject to COVID alterations. To prepare the inspector will look at the school website, policies and planning documents. It then usually involves a one day visit by an inspector, who will talk to pupils, parents, staff, governors and members of the church team. They will carry out a learning walk to explore physical evidence of the school's Christian character and observe collective worship and RE lessons.

Once upon a time, this was regarded as a tick list exercise to get through – often causing an increased workload for staff. The new style process is designed to help school leaders be intentional in what they do all the time. Decisions and actions start with 'Why are we doing it?', 'How are we doing it?' – and what is the impact. The inspection is about affirming what is of worth in the past and present, while supporting schools to work at transforming what is valuable but needs improvement.

The new SIAMS Evaluation schedule has one inspection question:

How effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?

This is explored through 7 strands:

Vision and leadership

Wisdom, Knowledge and Skills

Character Development: Hope, Aspiration and Courageous Advocacy

Community and Living Well Together

Dignity and Respect

The impact of collective worship

The effectiveness of religious education

One overall grade is awarded, reflecting the contribution of these strands to the flourishing of pupils **and adults** in a church school. In addition, a standalone grade is awarded in all schools for collective worship. In 2016 Langley Fitzurse was awarded 'Outstanding', however the grading system has changed, with 'Good' being the new gold standard and only a small proportion of schools gaining 'Excellent'. Whatever grade the school is awarded, we continue to proud that we are an inclusive, friendly church school with a family feel. We know our purpose is to amaze, excite and inspire confident, happy, and resilient children so they can reach their full potential.


Pegasus Class then will be able to swap books on 22nd October, Chameleon 2nd November, etc.
