Candlemas and Christingle

On the 2nd February Christians celebrate the feast of Candlemas. It is a pivotal moment in the Church year as we mark the end of the Christmas season, when we have been celebrating Jesus, born as a human baby. Now we turn towards Lent and Easter, thinking about Jesus having grown up, dying on a cross and coming to life again as the risen Lord.



Candlemas used to be the time of year when people would bring their candles to church and ask for God's blessing. It's a time to give thanks for light, hope and the approach of spring. Jesus said he was the Light of the World: like a torch to show us the way to go; like a nightlight to bring comfort and hope; like birthday candles which brings joy into our lives.

Christians are called to shine God's light into our world – we do this by loving and caring for each other. At this time of year, we raise money for The Children's Society, a charity which empowers young people to make positive changes and rediscover their hope.

Next week, as part of our learning at home and school we will be making Christingles. This is advanced warning for gathering things at home: you will need an orange, some red ribbon or tape, a candle, 4 cocktail/small sticks, a piece of foil and some sweeties—jelly tots, raisins—things to put on your sticks.

Our Christingle Service is always a big highlight of the school year, so we are delighted to announce that it will be going ahead remotely on **Wednesday 10th February** at 5.30pm. It will be led by Rev Mark Siddal, and we will send you a Zoom link nearer the time, along with instructions on how to make your Christingle!

But lying always hurts us and separates us from the people we love. Zacchaeus felt God's love and forgiveness. Meeting Jesus changed his heart. He wanted to make things right with everyone he had cheated.

How did Zacchaeus change after meeting Jesus?

Why is honesty important in our relationships with other people?
