Communication and Language

- © **Listening** quietly during activities and responding to ideas expressed by others in conversation and discussions. Responding to instructions involving a two part sequence.

Physical Development

- © Fine Motor Handling tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with increasing control. Using a pencil and holding it effectively to form recognisable letters.
- Gross Motor Balance bikes and targeted games to learn ball skills, throwing, rolling and kicking.

Expressive Art and Design

- **○Textiles** fabric collage **○Drawing** Use and control different media.
- **Sculpture** Build a construction/ sculpture using a variety of objects
- © Selecting tools and using techniques needed to shape, assemble and join materials they are using. Understand that different media can be combined to create new effects. Develop their own ideas and then decide which materials to use to express them.

Literacy © Word Reading – *Identifying rhymes. Read some letter groups that each represent one word and say the sound for them. Read common exception words and simple phrases and sentences. Re-reading books to build up their confidence, their fluency and their understanding and enjoyment of reading.

© Writing - Writing some irregular common words. Spell small familiar words correctly and making phonetically plausible attempts complex words. Orally rehearse sentences before writing captions and simple sentences. Start to re-read.

Start to orally rehearse captions and sentences before writing which can be read by themselves. Using finger spaces.
