**Literacy** Word Reading – Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and 10 diagraphs. Read all common **exception words** and simple phrases and sentences. Re-reading books to build up confidence, fluency and understanding and an enjoyment of reading. © Comprehension - Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary. Recall simple Christian and Jewish stories and use new vocabulary related to those religions. © Writing - Form lower case and capital letters correctly. *Orally rehearse* sentences and phrases before writing so that they can be read by themselves and sometimes by others. Writing some irregular common words. Re-read what they have written to make sure it makes sense. Spell words by identifying

sounds in them and representing the

sounds with a letter or letters. Use

finger spaces to separate words.
