Literacy © Word Reading – Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and 10 diagraphs. Read all common exception words and simple phrases and sentences. Re-reading books to build up their confidence, their fluency and their understanding and enjoyment of reading. © Comprehension Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary. Recall simple Christian and Jewish stories and use new vocabulary related to those religions. © Writing - Form lower case and capital letters correctly. Orally rehearse sentences before writing sentences and phrases that can be read by themselves and sometimes by others. Writing some irregular common words. Re-read what they have written to make sure it makes sense. Spell words by identifying sounds in them and representing the sounds with a letter or letters. Use finger spaces to separate words. Comprehension Using vocabulary and events from stories

in their play.
