Expectations/ Home School Agreement Your child's education is a partnership.

- What we expect from the children

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/hat we expect from parents

- Supporting your child in his/her learning through practice at home and promoting positive attitudes
- Encourage personal independence by making sure children have the correct equipment in school – PE kits on correct days, wet weather coat, sun hats etc.
- Support the school's policies, including home learning and uniform
- Make sure that you have given the updated permissions and contact information, this includes e-safety, photographic consent.
- Contacting your child's class teacher if you have any questions or queries through the school office or via email or with class teacher at the beginning or end of day.

Should my child go to school today?

Every day Counts

Headache, earache and stomach ache

- Children with headache, earache or stomach ache can go to school just let the staff know that they have felt unwell.
- Give paracetamol and plenty of fluids to drink.
- If headache, earache or stomach ache persist seek medical advice.

High temperature

- Give paracetamol and plenty to drink. After paracetamol, if your child feels better, bring them in to school.
- If the child's high temperature continues for 3 days or more, seek medical advice.

Coughs and colds

- Children should be given paracetamol, plenty of fluids to drink and can be sent to school.
- If your child is asthmatic, remember they may need their blue inhaler more often.

Flu and swine flu

• Children should go back to school when recovered – this is usually about 5 days.

Sore throat, tonsillitis and glandular fever

- Children should be given paracetamol, plenty of fluids to drink and can be sent to school. Diarrhoea and vomiting
- Children can return to school 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting.

<u>Measles</u>

• Children should return to school 4 days after the rash has STARTED.

Chicken Pox

• Children should return to school 5 days after the rash has STARTED.

<u>German measles</u>


- Children should return to school 6 days after the rash has STARTED.
