
Chameleon Class Newsletter End of Term 3

As we come to the end of Term 3, we wanted to take a moment to reflect on the fantastic achievements of Chameleon Class. We have been incredibly proud of how the children have applied themselves, particularly with their outstanding contributions to our school production of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat*. Our annual school production requires tremendous commitment from the entire school community, and we could not have done it without your invaluable support. This term, Chameleon Class has been busy with a wide range of engaging learning experiences. In English, our writing has been inspired by the book *Secrets of the Sun King*. The children explored persuasive writing, crafting letters to Howard Carter, urging him to reconsider entering King Tutankhamun's tomb. They also delved into the features of newspaper reports and participated in various reading comprehension activities based on the book.

In Maths, Year 5 students have been focusing on fractions, working hard to understand and simplify them. Year 6 students have been tackling measurement conversions, fractions, and complex word problems. We have been thoroughly impressed with their dedication and the positive approach they have shown in their maths lessons.

For History, Chameleon Class has been learning about Ancient Egypt. The children explored the significance of the River Nile and the fascinating world of Egyptian gods. In Science, our focus has been on classifying organisms, where the students developed a solid understanding of how to group and categorise living things.

In Art, we explored the works of various abstract artists, using their techniques to depict emotions. The children did a wonderful job explaining what each colour represented and thoroughly enjoyed experimenting with different painting styles.

Our RE lessons have had the children finding out about pilgrimage. After sharing some of the important moments in our own lives, we learnt about Hajj: one of the five pillars of Islam, and the significance of Muslims visiting Mecca. We will continue this topic a little after half term, where we will have a visitor into class to share his own pilgrimage experiences.

For Computing, the children learned about databases, both digital and non-digital. They compared the two types, gaining valuable insights into how data is organised and utilised.
