Dear Parents

As we draw to the close of what has been another very busy term at Langley Fitzurse, I wish to thank you for your support working in partnership to ensure the best possible primary school experience for your child/ren. With World Book Day and hosting the Travelling Book Fayre in school—books have been a great stimulus within our curriculum. Support for the book fayre was tremendous, £722.54 worth of books were sold, earning a fantastic £289.02 of commission for the school. Watch out for new books in our library and classrooms soon!



This term has been one of many illnesses, for both for children and staff. There doesn't seem to have been the cold snap to kill off the bugs and so these have been passed around the classes and families! We have reminded children about Catch It, Bin it Kill it and the importance of good hand hygiene in order to mitigate the spread of infection. I hope the two week Easter break will provide the break to reduce further spread.

Once again we have been focusing on academic outcomes—reading, writing, maths, phonics this term. This will of course continue into the summer term. Whilst Easter is a time to recharge and relax, I also

ask that time is spent practice the core skills that they have been developing in class—little and often practise will support your child to reinforce and build on prior knowledge and learning from day 1 when we return for the Summer Term. This is for all children, as in every year, we are preparing our children for the next steps in their learning—our Reception children for Year 1, our Year 1 children for Year 2 and so on.

You may remember that this time last year we sought parental view on Langley Fitzurse as a Church School. It would be most appreciated if you could complete this survey. People may not know what the governors' role is in support of the school. I certainly didn't know before I joined. Governors are volunteers, they donate their time and professional skills to the school to challenge and support the school teams. We appoint the headteacher and hold them to account for the educational performance of the schools. We set the strategic direction of the schools and make key decisions that affect how the school is run. We oversee the financial performance of the school ensuring its money is well spent to improve outcomes for children. You may see us observing lessons, performing health and safety walks, investigating new projects or listening to the concerns of the staff and parents. It is a wonderful way to use your skills to improve the school and support the village. Thank you to all of our governors for volunteering their time to support the school.

This term, our PTA arranged a music quiz with the wonderful Steve and Liz Howe from Crowzone Radio (and organisers of Scarecrows). It took place in the village hall and was packed with entrants, who all enjoyed the food kindly provided by many of the parents. The quiz, bar and raffle were a great success and raised money for First Access Violins, meaning that children at the school will all get a chance to learn the violin. I was very pleased to be part of the team named after the school, the Langley Hitz.
