School Trips and Events...

Chameleon Nature in Art Museum – Wednesday 5th November

Year 6 travelled to Gloucester to visit the Nature in Art Gallery and Sculpture Garden. On arrival we were welcomed into the Education Centre by Laura and her team of helpers. First, the children made collages out of cut up rectangles of newspaper, using black and white print for the background so that their picture made from colourful tissue paper would pop. Some of the children chose to link their collage to this term's science topic of Earth and Space and the rest chose something from nature. After a short break, during our second workshop, we learnt how to bend garden wire to make the shape of a petal or a butterfly wing. Then the children dipped their wire loops into fantasy film paint (a new experience for all). This amazing paint then air dried to create a stained glass, opaque effect. Everyone made either a flower with five petals or a butterfly. After lunch we explored the Sculpture Garden- the giant golden eagle was amazing. We went round the gallery exhibits and had the time to sketch some of our favourite pieces of art. Finally, we met the artist in residence, Shelly Perkins. She explained to the children how she starts all her ideas with a pencil line drawing and then uses her computer to add up to over 100 layers of colour to finally produce her finished piece. This process could take her a few weeks. We used her art as inspiration to create our own nature-themed water colour paintings in school, which are now on display in our classroom for everyone to enjoy. What a fantastic trip!



Chameleon Lacrosse @ St Mary's - Wednesday 19th November

Chameleon Class had the wonderful opportunity to visit St Mary's School in Calne to try their hand at Lacrosse. Excitement filled the minibus as we set off after lunch, and before long we were exploring the impressive new sports hall. Our instructor introduced us to the basics of the game, showing us how to pass and catch the ball, move into space, and anticipate play during a match. After some practice drills, we put our new skills to the test in a series of short matches against other groups....



Everyone took turns on the pitch while teammates cheered enthusiastically from the sidelines, creating a fantastic sporting atmosphere. The teams were evenly matched, and Chameleon Class played brilliantly—scoring several times! Most importantly, it was the teamwork, the skills we gained, and the sheer enjoyment of the afternoon that made the experience so memorable.
