### The Disadvantaged Learner Lead (DLL)

- ✓ is supported by a job description to help clarify this role in school
- ✓ accesses and implements good practice from targeted training, including DLL network meetings
- ✓ takes on the role of advocate for disadvantaged learners

### Leadership, Teachers & Staff

- ✓ are actively committed to the school's Pupil Premium strategy
- ✓ are able to discuss and consult on this agenda with the DLL and Pupil Premium Governor
- ✓ know who the disadvantaged learners are in school, and provide excellent teaching and learning opportunities

### Governors, including the Pupil Premium Governor

- ✓ are committed to ensuring the best possible outcomes for disadvantaged learners
- ✓ understand their school's context with regard to disadvantaged learners
- ✓ support the Pupil Premium Governor to work closely with the DLL to ensure the best possible outcomes for disadvantaged learners

### Parents, Carers & the Wider Community

- ✓ benefit from strategies that engage them to help with their child's learning
- ✓ are supported by strong relationships within the school and community
- ✓ benefit from good communication by the school so that they are aware of all relevant funding and support
