

School Uniform

Wearing school uniform supports a sense of belonging. We expect all pupils to take pride in their appearance and take care of their clothes. The school colours are grey and gold/yellow. Ties are available as a privilege for Year 6 pupils, who may also wear white shirts and grey V-necked pullovers.

School uniform is available to purchase from the school office or online via the Schoolwear from Less link on the school website. Second-hand uniform is also available from the office, and sales take place two or three times a year. Parents experiencing difficulty in funding school

uniform are encouraged to approach the school to see what help is available.

Following discussions at School Council, and health and Safety guidelines, it has been decided that only watches and stud type earrings are allowed in school. All other jewellery should stay at home. Mrs Dixon requests that watches are not worn in Hercules class.

In the summer term you will receive a detailed school report about your child's progress in all areas of the curriculum and about their involvement in the life of the school.

We also hold a Celebration Assembly every Monday at 2.45pm to praise children's successes both at school and outside.
