

# Creating Complex (Multi-Clause) Sentences Dice

## Instructions

You will need: scissors, glue, whiteboards, pens, timer.

1. Carefully cut out the nets, then fold and stick them together to form two dice.
2. Place all of the topic cards in a pile face down on the table.
3. Decide who will be player one and let them choose a topic card and roll one of the dice. They then have just two minutes to write a complex (multi-clause) sentence on the topic using that particular subordinating conjunction/relative pronoun.

For example, if you were to choose a topic card that said 'football' and the dice roll gave you the conjunction 'since', you could write...

**Since the goalkeeper seemed unable to catch the ball, he was dropped from the team.**

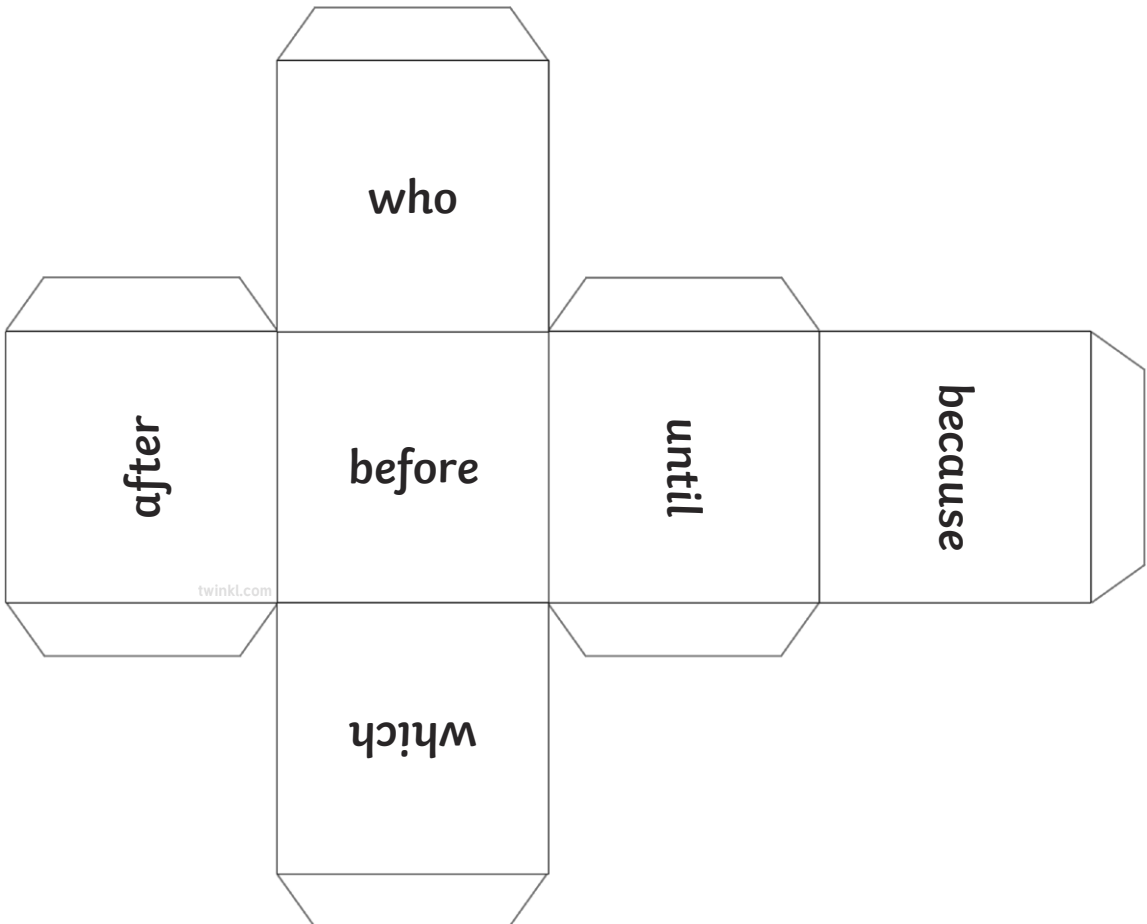
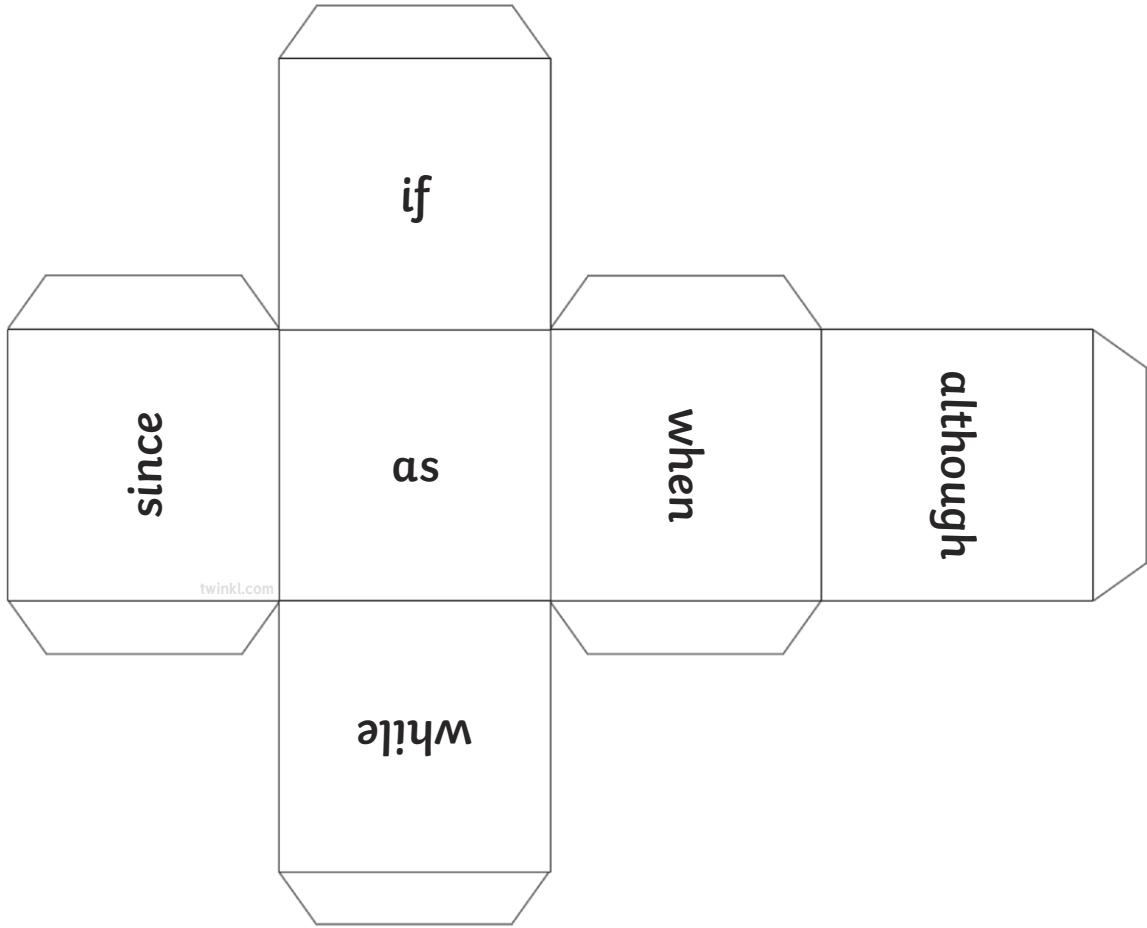
or you could put the subordinate clause after the main clause and write...

**The goalkeeper was dropped from the team since he seemed unable to catch the ball.**

If the player manages to create a sensible complex (multi-clause) sentence in the given time with the correct punctuation, they are awarded a point.

Play passes over to the next person in the group. The first player to score five points is the winner!
