Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

I appreciate that many of you will not be able to dedicate hours each day to teaching your child while they are at home. Please do a little each day if you can or try and put aside some half days to do schoolwork.

The most valuable thing you can do during your time at home is to keep practising phonics. Phonics is the bedrock of reading and writing. The children have made fantastic progress this year and it is vital to keep this going in order to reach end of year expectations.

EYFS Maths

We have been learning to count, read and write numbers to 20.

Activities:

Practise making a number line

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20

Cut up your number line and jumble the numbers up. How quickly can you put them back in order?

Close your eyes and ask your parent to take a number from your line.

Which number is missing? How do you know?

"I know 15 is missing because it is one more than 14 and one less than 16"

Extension:

Choose two numbers to add together and write the number sentence.

Choose two numbers, take the smaller number away from the bigger number. Write the number sentence.

Year 1 Maths

Please continue to practise counting in 5s and 10s. We would have been working on this until the end of term.

There are lots of videos on YouTube that you can count along to.

Practise counting real things such as 5p and 10p coins, how many of each do you need to make 30p? 50p? £1?

Practise making a number line

Cut up your number line and jumble the numbers up. How quickly can you put them back in order?

Extension: Introduce counting in 2s.
