Federation Update

On Monday, at the Full Governing Body meeting, the governors ratified the decision to hard federate with Stanton St Quintin Primary School.

You may be wondering what this means now? The proposed date for Hard Federation is the 2nd November 2020, and the governors of both schools, together with the local authority will be working on the legalities to allow this to happen. From this date ,both existing Governing Bodies will dissolve and a new Governing Body will be formed, one which will be accountable for both schools. From a leadership point of view, the systems that are in place today will remain the same. The quality of teaching and learning across the school will be as good as ever. Opportunities for collaboration across the schools will be explored, and as time goes on, shared economies of scale will support the efficiencies of both schools. Both schools will retain their own identities, vision and ethos.
