COVID Update

With the schools first positive case this week, it really hits home how important it is to follow the Government guidelines to keep the school community as safe as it possibly can be. Recent changes:

Self-isolation period reduced from 14 days to 10 days

Self-isolation is essential to reducing the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) as it breaks the chains of transmission. After reviewing the evidence, the Department for Health and Social Care is now confident that we can reduce the number of days that contacts self-isolate from 14 days to 10 days. This was set out in the UK Chief Medical Officers' statement on the self-isolation period on 11 December.

From this date, the self-isolation period for close contacts of a positive case of coronavirus (COVID-19) has changed from 14 to 10 days. This change applies to all those who are currently self-isolating including those who commenced self-isolation before today. This means that if you are on the 11th, 12th or 13th day of your current self-isolation period today - you can stop isolating. Any new cases identified for selfisolation will be advised to self-isolate for 10 days.

Schools will continue to monitor the COVIDALERT inbox for positive COVID results for six days after the school breaks up. This is because schools will need to identify close contacts if a case became symptomatic up to 48 hours after last being in school. This email address should be used for both Langley Fitzurse families and Stanton families.

For example:

If a pupil/staff member finishes school on Friday 18 December:

- Develops Covid Symptoms on Sunday 20 December (within 48 hours of last being in school)
- Gets tested on Monday 21 December
- Receives a positive result on Wednesday 23 December
- Schools will be notified by email on 23 December and schools will contact Public Health.
- If necessary parents will be then notified by schools re actions to take.

Should parents need to contact during the Christmas break the following information would be really helpful to have to hand.

Has your child tested positive for COVID-19?

If YES you need to inform the school as soon as possible The school will need the following information to carry out a risk assessment of who may be a close contact:

Date of onset of COVID-19 symptoms (including what symptoms they had) Date of the test


Date of the result (and evidence of the result/ID number)



Date your child was last in school

How do they get to school? E.g. walk, cycle, car, public transport, school transport, taxi

If by car - do you car share with anyone else?



If public transport/school transport

- do they know who they sat near?

Please provide any additional information you may have as to pupils or staff your child may have been in contact with during this period.

Please note: The infectious period is 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms (or date of the test if tested when asymptomatic).
