

Foundation Governor Vacancy

Langley Fitzurse was originally formed by the Church of England, and we remain a committed and vibrant church school. Every governor is responsible for nurturing this aspect of school life, as a positive underpinning to the development of our pupils. Like other governor roles, such as finance or child protection, certain governors play a more active role in leading this agenda. These are the Foundation Governors, and we now have a vacancy for someone to join this team.

There are 3 Foundation Governors on the new Federated Board. Each has to be approved by the Diocese, to perform the role. As a Foundation Governor you would perform all the other roles open to governors, but also have a special emphasis to further a distinctively Christian ethos.

I have just stepped down after 3 rewarding years as Chair of Governors, in the capacity of a Foundation Governor.
