

COVID Information during Christmas Break

Information regarding COVID for school and the community is moving at a really fast pace.!

The Department for Education have just released the following guidance for schools, and have requested that **parents continue to contact school for the first 6 days of the school holiday—this will be up to and including 24th December 2020**, should their child or a member of their family be unwell and go on to have a positive test.

'Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term, schools do not need to be informed about their absence until the first day of the new term.'

The school has created a CovidAlert email that will be monitored on a daily basis during this period: **COVIDALERT@stanton-st-quintin.wilts.sch.uk** Please note that despite the address, this email should be used for Langley Fitzurse families

If you do need to inform the school ,then your email will be acknowledged and the school will then be in touch with Public Health so that they can advise the next steps from a school perspective.
