How the Challenge will work in Wiltshire libraries this year

- The challenge will run from **Sat 10 July to Sat 4 Sept.**
- Children will sign up at their local library and receive a set of materials (poster and stickers), with information for parents about giving out the stickers.
- When children have completed the challenge they will collect their certificate and medal from the library and talk to staff about their experience.

In addition, libraries will also be running the '**Climate action footprint challenge**' - a fun activity with an environmental theme, with prizes for some lucky participants.

Please also spend a little time over the holidays keeping key literacy and numeracy skills fresh. This can be through regular reading, any writing opportunities including puzzles and spellings, any number work—number facts, number spotting and or reading if you are out and about, number ordering—larger or smaller than, and of course number bonds and time tables.

By doing something, little and often, your child will come back more confident in the skills they have development this year and ready to apply these in their new learning.
