Dear Parents

A very warm welcome back to school. I hope you have had a good summer break. It is wonderful to have all the children back in class and fully immersed in their learning, and to see how well our new Reception children are settling in. It was wonderful to see so many families at the Welcome Service at St Peters Church on Sunday. This is just the start of a year where we can hopefully be 'together' more in person, and grow our school community.

Over the next two weeks, we will be holding Meet and Greet sessions for you to meet with your child's class teacher. These will take place at 2.45pm to tie in with pick up at the end of the school day. For parents who are unable to attend, we will send the content of the meeting home electronically. Class letters and curriculum maps to outline the areas of learning will also be shared this week.

I am very much looking forwards to the new school year, hopefully one that is less disrupted by COVID. The school still has a Risk Assessment that identifies and mitigates infection as best as possible in school; and includes a contingency action plan should there be any positive cases at Langley. In general though, the school is back to being a whole school, with whole School Collective Worship, singing, the reintroduction of the Buddy System and as the term progresses some extra-curricular school clubs. We will retain the split break and lunch times, together with receiving the children at the front of the school at the beginning and of the day as we have found that these work well for us.

Lots happened at school during the summer closure. I am sure if you have been passing, you will have seen lots of vans and contractors. The school had a new emergency fire system, emergency lighting and new IT wifi systems installed. Once we are connected to the super fast broadband we should be whizzing!

We have also had some staffing changes over the summer break too. We have welcomed Mrs Helen Rimmer, who will be Hercules' Class Teacher to our school team, plus Mrs Stables and Mrs Plaskitt who will also be joining Hercules Class as TA support. We also have a new name but not a new member of staff – Miss Causer got married in August and is now Mrs Webster!

We were very sad to say goodbye to Mrs Moor at the end of August. She has left Langley to embark on new challenges, and we wish her every success in the future. This has lead us to look at the office structure in a different way. Mrs Howe will continue to be the school's Administrator but will now also be the point of contact for booking wrap around care and school clubs.
