This is an overview of some of the subject matter that we will be learning about this term.

English:

This term will see us exploring traditional tales with a link to growing plants, such as Jack and the Beanstalk, The Princess and the Pea, Sleeping Beauty, The Enormous Turnip and Thumbelina. We will explore features of traditional tales and work towards writing our own. There will be links to science by writing Instruction texts about growing plants.

Science:

We will start off by completing some sessions about 'Everyday materials' and their properties, followed on by our new topic of plants. This will include identifying and naming common wild and garden plants, describing their basic structure and what they need to grow and stay healthy. We will grow some cress from seeds and further consolidate our learning by having an outing to 'Cut the Mustard' in Tetbury.
